TIPS for APPLICANTS Tips for Creating Strong Personal Statement Carol E. Macpherson Memorial Scholarship

Note: We want you to succeed. After you have completed a draft of your application, gather your questions and feel free to email or call us to help you.

Personal Statements

- 1. Creating a strong Personal Statement
 - a. Your life purpose and goals
 - i. What is your major and why did you choose it?
 - ii. What makes you passionate about this choice?
 - iii. What do you intend to do once you graduate? (Go to work? Grad School? Other?)
 - b. Include what makes you unique
 - Speak to how you would stand out as an awardee Ex: Nothing will stop me from meeting my goals, so I know I will one day be an alum who . . .
 - Why you would be a GREAT FIT for this particular scholarship?
 Mention how you fit the criteria, if not included in a prior section.
 Might include if you have something in common with the person the scholarship was named for or is honoring.
 - c. Outline struggles and obstacles you have overcome (while honoring your right to privacy and comfort with self-disclosure when sharing details).
 - d. Need
 - i. Things not reflected in financial aid alone: inter-generational poverty, additional expenses that are not reflected in your financial aid or income (child-care, health and medical costs, recent loss of income or other hardship)
 - e. Include your timeline and other academic details
 - i. What year are you in? When do you plan on graduating?
 - ii. What is your GPA? (Do not apply if you do not meet required GPA.) If there are issues with your GPA explain why it is lower than it should be. Ex: I started college 10 years ago and was just not ready, I got all Fs my first term, dropped out and have been working ever since. I have gotten nothing by As and Bs since I re-entered but my overall GPA is still calculated with those old grades.

2. Polish it!

- a. Go back and read the criteria/questions in the application materials. Did you answer all their questions?
- b. Use spellcheck but don't rely on it completely.
- c. Read your statement out loud to yourself when completed. Does it sound clear to your ear? Does it flow?

d. Find at least two proof readers

- i. Chose academic staff as proof readers and editors, if possible.
- ii. Possible proofreaders include:
 - 1. Career Center staff
 - 2. Writing Center staff
 - 3. Academic advisor
 - 4. Instructor/TA
 - 5. If English is your second language, there may be an office on your campus that will help by proofreading.
 - 6. Your references? (only if you know them well as it is a lot to ask to do both)
 - 7. Staff from a campus program you are engaged with
 - 8. English major friend (but only if you have seen their writing or know they have gotten As in English)
 - 9. Some librarians might be willing to help.
 - 10. A neighbor or friend who is a teacher or works in Human Resources

3. Upload Personal Statement

Your Personal Statement should be submitted as a PDF or Word document (PDF recommended). *IMPORTANT: Save the file name as:

"YourLastName.YourFirstName.PersonalStatement" before uploading using the link on the Application Page.
